Dear Sub-Recipients,

I am the Chapter 7 Bankruptcy Trustee for the Nevada Fire Safe Council. As you may know the Bankruptcy Court approved a compromise with the Department of Justice to allow payments to "Sub-Recipients" (Settlement Agreement and Release).

The Settlement Agreement and Release provides for \$1,412,902 to be paid to what is listed in the agreement as the "Sub-Recipients" with certain restrictions. I have enclosed a spreadsheet that summarizes the Sub-Recipients, the allowed amount to be paid to each, whether or not that Sub-Recipient filed a proof of claim in the bankruptcy case and if so, the amount of that claim. Under the terms of the Settlement Agreement and Release, the Bankruptcy Court has approved to extend the time for all Sub-Recipients to file a proof of claim with the court. All new or amended proofs of claims must be filed within 35 days after the mailing of this notice.

Under the Settlement Agreement and Release a Sub-Recipient must timely file a proof of claim with the Bankruptcy Court to be paid the allowed amount listed on the enclosed spreadsheet. Per the settlement the Sub-Recipient will receive the lesser of the amount allowed or the amount on their proof of claim. If a Sub-Recipient does not timely file a proof of claim, then it will receive zero payments from the settlement. In order for a claim to be timely, it must be filed on or before the extended date approved by the Bankruptcy Court of April 10, 2020. A blank proof of claim (Form 410) and instructions are enclosed.

If a Sub-Recipient has previously filed a timely proof of claim in the bankruptcy case then they are not required to file a new or amended claim. If a Sub-Recipient has previously filed a proof of claim and the allowed amount per the settlement agreement is <u>larger</u> than the amount per their original proof of claim then a timely amended proof of claim is required to receive the larger amount.

- Attend both the February 12th TRPA Advisory Planning Commission (APC) meeting and the February 26th TRPA Governing Board meeting in support of proposed amendments to TRPA Code Chapter 61: Vegetation Management and Forest Health, Sections 61.1. (Tree Removal) and 61.2 (Prescribed Fire).
 Note: The Tahoe Fire and Fuels played a significant role in shaping these amendments which were unanimously recommended by the APC and unanimously approved by the Governing Board.
- Prepare and transmit memo (February 12) to Basin Fire Chiefs with the TRPA staff
 PowerPoint updating the State Route 89 Recreation Corridor Management Plan. Solicit
 input from the Chiefs and management team members from an emergency response
 perspective. Organize the input received for transmittal to TRPA staff.
- Track follow-up emails from Tahoe Douglas Assistant Chief Todd Moss regarding continued efforts to advance the identification of locations and the planning and development of dedicated Public Safety Piers (as defined in the TRPA Code of Ordinances) at strategic locations around Lake Tahoe.
- February 18 lunch meeting with US Forest Service LTBMU Forest Supervisor
 Jeff Marsolais to discuss Lake Tahoe Restoration Act (LTRA) appropriations
 moving through the Forest Service. Note: Jeff has been detailed to Washington
 D.C. for the next four months. Deputy Forest Supervisor Danelle Harrison is
 serving as the Acting LTBMU Forest Supervisor during Jeff's detail.
- Continue to track activities of and materials produced by the Lake Tahoe West Restoration Partnership Joint Stakeholder Committees Meetings.
- Continue working with staff and members of the 2019-2020 Nevada Legislative Committee for the Review and Oversight of the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency and the Marlette Lake System (NRS 218E.555) on agenda development for this year's Committee meetings. Note: A meeting that focuses on forest health is expected this spring.
- Continue preparations for Lake Tahoe Partnership March legislative trip to Washington, D.C. (March 9-11) to advocate for FY 2021 federal funding for the Lake Tahoe Restoration Act (LTRA) and for the release of SNPLMA Round 18 project nominations.
